Players Code of Conduct

- 2. It is unacceptable to verbally insult coaches (on either team), referees and/or spectators.
- 3. At all times avoid comments or gestures that express disagreement with the official's call.
- 4. Displays of temper, including needing to be held back from another player, throwing of helmets and/or other equipment will not be tolerated on the field or in playing area.
- 5. Convey a consistently positive attitude toward your teammates or coaches. Only coaches or captains should be telling others when they have made a mistake.
- 6. Always strive to follow the rules of the game.
- 7. Accept defeat with dignity and win with class. We do not gloat.
- 8. The Sheffield Giants pride ourselves on inclusivity. Any homophobic, racist or sexist behaviour or comments will be treated seriously.
- 9. Always follow the instructions of Coaches.
- 10. Players should be punctual and attend practises and games regularly. If they are unable to attend, they will notify coaches in advance (for example on spond).

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Parent Code of Conduct

Parents can be a positive influence on the game and are encouraged to attend as many games as possible to support the team. The extent to which spectators can be a positive influence, they can equally be a negative force. To help support the team Parents and spectators of the Sheffield Giants are expected to:

- 1. Remember that children are playing for their enjoyment, not yours.
- 2. Encourage fair play and respect for the laws of the game.
- Parents must let coaches and game officials deal with issues of discipline and conduct during games.
- 4. Teach that honest effort is as important as victory. Applaud good plays by ALL players, even those on opposing teams.
- 5. Avoid measuring success by individual achievement. Remember that this is a team game and team success is more important than individual touchdowns, yards gained or time on the field.
- 6. Respect the official's judgement and refrain from negative comments.
- 7. Recognise that all our coaches are volunteers, so be supportive and avoid criticism of tactics.
- 8. Remember timing is everything. Let the coaches coach and avoid communication with players during training and games.
- 9. Parents should not be in the 'player area' during games. They should never be on the field.
- 10. The Sheffield Giants pride ourselves on inclusivity. Any homophobic, racist or sexist behaviour or comments will be treated seriously.
